

HIGHLIGHTS OF MUSEO DABAWENYO'S ACCOMPLISHMENTS

November 2016

Exhibition

Museo Dabawenyo hosted the exhibition with the title: "Southern Beauty...An Art Exhibit!" featuring the works of a Davao-born self-taught visual artist and the president of the United Durian Artists, Mr. Alexander Alagon as well as the works of the officers and members of the group at the Bahaghari Space of the museum from November 15-26, 2016.

Promotional Activity

The staff of the official student publication of the University of Southeastern Philippines, "The Collegiate Headlight" conducted a photo shoot of the Museo Dabawenyo as part of their intention to feature the museum in their upcoming publication.

Cultural Undertakings

Museo Dabawenyo provided a venue for the "Patrioyotiko Mindanao", a broad multi-sectoral and interfaith alliance of concerned individuals, groups, and organization at the Peace Hall on November 12, 2016, with the aim of spreading awareness on current issues, to welcome the anti-imperialism stance of President Duterte, to discuss updates and plan activities that will support the president in his declaration of independent foreign policy. The assembly was participated by 15 individuals.

The Brothers of the Sacred Heart Youth Ministry conducted spiritual and value formation activities for eight (8) members of the Indigenous People at the Bantawan Area of the museum on November 20, 2016.

Familiarization Tour

On November 11, 2016, Ms. Winnie Rose Bulig, Museum Researcher II, visited some of the museums in Tanauan City, Batangas such as the Apolinario Mabini Museum, Museo Ng Tanauan, Jose P. Laurel Ancestral House, and the Old Church St. John the Evangelist Cathedral during her attendance to the "History Museum as a Learning Tool" seminar-workshop conducted by the National Historical Commission of the Philippines from November 10-11, 2016.

Museum Guests

A total of 5,966 guests came to the museum in November to learn more about our rich historical and cultural heritage.

3,068 or 51% were walk-in tourists, 1,847 or 31% were school-based (institutions) visitors, and 1,051 or 18% were lakbay-aral delegates.

Of the 1,847 school-based visitors, 1,094 or 59% were from Davao City, while 753 students or 41% came from Regions V, X, XI (except Davao City),

and the ARMM.

Breaking down the 3,068 walk-in visitors into three categories, the domestic visitors top the list at 1,881 or 61%, the local visitors at 1,103 or 36%, and the foreign visitors at 84 or 3%.

Seminar/Training

Mr. Orly L. Escarrilla, OIC, attended a two-day training with the title: "Seminar Workshop on Operational Leadership for City Government Department Heads and Chiefs of Offices" conducted by the Human Resource Management Office (HRMO) on November 4-5, 2016 at the Ritz Hotel, Garden Oases, Porras St., Bo. Obrero, Davao City.

On November 10-11, 2016, Ms. Winnie Rose Galay-Bulig, Museum Researcher II, attended a two-day Seminar-Workshop Series 3 on the "History Museum as a Learning Tool" conducted by the National Historical Commission of the Philippines and held at the Mabini Shrine, Tanauan City Batangas. The seminar aimed to demonstrate the instructive component of history museums as a supplement to classroom and museum learnings.
