Museo Dabawenyo conducted its seasonal exhibition with the title: "Development, Money and Power" at the Bahaghari Space from November 16 up to December 8, 2017, featuring various artifacts that were products of development and influences of power struggle by colonization globally.

Museum Visitors

A total of 3,831 visitors came to the museum in November to learn more about our rich historical and cultural heritage.

2,804 or 73% were walk-in visitors, 484 or 13% were institutional visitors and 543 or 14% were lakbay-aral visitors.

Of the 484 school-based visitors, 186 or 38% were from Davao City, while 298 or 62% came from Regions XI (except Davao City) and the ARMM.

Breaking down the 2,804 walk-in visitors into three categories, the domestic visitors top the list at 1,639 or 58%, the local visitors at 1,047 or 37%, and the foreign visitors at 118 or 4%.
